10 FILTHY FACTS

- More than TWO MILLION PIECES of litter are dropped in the UK every day. This means 23 ITEMS OF RUBBISH are being dropped on our streets every second!
- 30 MILLION TONNES of litter are collected from our streets every year enough to fill FOUR WEMBLEY STADIUMS.
- Street cleaning costs the UK up to £1 BILLION A YEAR! Removing each piece of chewing gum from a street can cost up to FIFTY TIMES the amount it cost to buy the chewing gum in the first place!
- 04 62% of people in England drop litter, but only 28% of people will admit to it.
- Dropping Litter is ILLEGAL, people who drop litter can be given a fixed penalty notice!
- On average the RSPCA receive 10 CALLS A DAY (OR 3,650 A YEAR) about animals harmed by litter, and this doesn't include the wild animals affected by litter that are never found.
- 10 MILLION TONNES of litter ends up in the world's oceans and seas every year and an estimated 80% OF THIS COMES FROM LAND.
- The five MOST COMMON types of LITTER are:
 Cigarette butts Chocolate and sweet wrappers Plastic bottles and cans Fast food packaging Alcoholic drinks
- 09 More than 4.5 TRILLION CIGARETTE BUTTS are dropped around the world each year!
- 10 LITTER ATTRACTS MORE LITTER if a street already has litter many people don't see the harm in adding a little bit more!














donation to FRS. Pens collection will be ongoing, to both recycle and provide funds for FRS.

For a 2nd year Planet Protectors and Gardening Club will be monitoring the re wilding of our playground banks. The grass was cut in the autumn and wild flowers are beginning to grow. We will be counting the number of pollinating and other insects that visit the flowers as well as the variety of wildflowers growing and compare these year on year.

Recycling Glue Sticks

Planet Protectors have been trialing out new glue sticks that Mr Norris discovered at a Headteachers conference recently. The



sticks can be refilled saving manufacturing of extra casing and the refill cases can be repurposed or recycled unlike the current glue we use. Planet Protectors have discovered that the new glue is stickier, they need to use less of it and it is smooth and not lumpy, so they have given it the thumbs up! We hope to order for the whole school soon.
