"On Tuesday the 23 of May Y5 and Y6 Visited The Manchester Museum.

It was such an amazing experience. There were so many topics to learn about from the Prehistoric era to modern history. Our personal favourites were the Golden Mummies Exhibit and the Extinct Exhibit. In the Golden Mummies

Exhibit there was so much to learn. We learned about how the Ancient Egyptians weighed the heart and if it was too heavy they got into heaven but if it was too light you would go to hell. In the Extinct area we learned about what sea life looked like over a million years ago.
