Dear Friends of Rainow School,

Back in 2019, I introduced a 'quiet table' outside my classroom as a place that identified children could use, with a pass, at lunchtimes to help them regulate their emotions. In September 2020, on returning to school after the first Covid lockdown, the need for a safe and calm space away from the bustle of the playground and the dinner hall grew, and the table for two, outside the Y6 classroom, was in great demand.

In 2022, I qualified as a Senior Mental Health Lead and part of my action plan was an idea to create a safe space outside to allow children to take part in quieter activities: read, play games and puzzles, draw etc. This was backed up by feedback from the pupil survey. Lots of children didn't like the noise and the ball games and reported that the busy playground can be a stressful place for them.

In 2023, the newly created Rainow Reps (our version of a school council), started collecting ideas for a quiet area to hold their weekly Calm Club. They drew designs and even made models. We knew that we didn't have a budget for this so were looking at ways to use what we already had.

Fast forward to 2024 and the FRS wanting to create something to commemorate the school's 40th birthday; this tiny acorn of an idea could finally grow. The children, Mr Marg and I put ideas together to create a design that incorporated different areas and seating spaces, built in a position with an amazing view to appreciate, and most importantly, an indoor space to be used in all weather.

The children wanted it to be a cosy place and have furnished it with cushions, blankets and beanbags. There are card games, Lego, puzzles and craft activities to use as well as a selection of wellbeing books to read – all chosen by the Reps.

Thank you so much for the funding for this project. It will make a huge difference to the wellbeing of our school community, not only at lunchtimes but as a place for nurture and mental health interventions to take place. It will be an invaluable addition to our school environment. Welcome to 'Ridge View'.
